Instructor Biography

Captain Brian Burris, 25 years at Worcester Fire Department. Twenty years and counting on 'the line' (Operations, engine companies), nine years as a firefighter and 16 as a lieutenant. 20 years and counting hazmat/WMD/counter-terrorism training through State and National Fire Services, the National Consortium (Center for Domestic Preparedness, Counter-Terrorism Operations Support, New Mexico Tech Energetic Materials & Research Testing Center, & the Security and Emergency Response Training Center), DHS & FEMA, and TEEX. 5 years as the department SARA officer and Hazmat Code Enforcement, with approximately 400 hazardous facilities including 130 SARA facilities and 200+ labs-using-chemicals. Currently a Captain on Ladder 5 and continuing to do the SARA/Hazmat position which includes Inventory evaluations, ERP, HMMP guidance, hazard analyses, plans reviews, & hazmat response as an information resource.
